Parents' Evening and Information Sharing

Throughout the school year, there will be **3 points of information sharing** regarding your child's progress and attainment between yourselves and your child's class teacher(s).

You will be invited to attend a parents' evening in October and March and both of these will be held in your child's classroom. Dates for these will be shared in due course. You will also **receive a school report** detailing your child's progress and attainment at the end of the academic year, this will be the **third point** of information sharing.

Parents will also be invited into school on several occasions throughout the academic year to attend events such as Celebration Assemblies, Performances and open afternoons!

Official Assessments

The children will **complete assessments every term in English and Maths**. Other subjects will be assessed **at the end of each topic**. These assessments will be used to best support future planning and provision to best enhance children's learning.

Year 6 children will complete SATs in the Summer Term. Details regarding this procedure will be provided to parents nearer the time.



PE Days

OTIS will teach PE to **all children EVERY Wednesday.**

Year 5 will have a PE lesson **EVERY Friday.**

Children are required to come to school in their PE kits on their allocated PE days. We kindly ask all parents to ensure their child has a clean, spare change of clothes that is kept in school on their peg to change if their PE kits become wet or dirty.

Reading Books and Reading Records



The children will each have a Reading Record to log reading at home.

Please **date, sign and write a comment** in your child's reading record **EVERY time you read your child's school book** with them at home and inform us when the book needs changing.



Administering Medication

If you need school to administer any medication to your child, please collect a medication administration form from the office and complete with the relevant details.

Please note, school cannot administer **ibuprofen** unless prescribed by the doctor. If your child needs pain relief, you can use the medication administration form to request the administration of Calpol.



Homework

Children will be sent home with a **Year 5/6 Homework Bingo Board in their homework book** every half term. The Homework Bingo Board consists of **25 different homework tasks**, which include **reading, maths, spellings, writing, science and other creative topic-related work**. The children can choose which tasks they would like to complete every week and can **earn house points** by completing a line, full house or all 4 corners of the board. There is no limit to the amount of homework the children complete every week, however our **expectations for homework are for children to have read at least 3 times a week**.

Children will have the opportunity to share their completed homework with their class teacher.

Celebration and Award Assemblies



We will be holding a Celebration Assembly in the school hall **every other Friday** at 09:00-09:30 am for Key Stage 2 children. Parents of children receiving an award or certificate, will be notified prior to the assembly and will be invited into school to watch their child being presented with their award.



Lost Property

Any unnamed items of clothing or equipment will be sent to our lost property collection which can be located at the end of the covered way. Please help us to reduce the amount of lost property by clearly naming all suitable items of uniform. If your child accidentally comes home with another child's item of uniform, please ensure you return it to school.



Playtime Snacks

The children can have a snack during their morning playtime and this snack can be brought from home. **Please could we remind parents that all food items brought into school should be nut free.**



Clubs

School will be offering the children the opportunity to take part in some **extra curricular clubs after school**. These clubs will **run every week** from mid September. Details regarding the different clubs, times and days will be sent out via Class Dojo soon.

Club sign up is via ParentPay and will be on a first come, first served basis.

Mr Tweedie and his OTIS team will also be continuing their **OTIS club** afterschool (remember to send your child into school in their uniform on these days with their OTIS kits in a bag to put on their peg).



School Trips

We will keep you updated with relevant information throughout the year relating to any school trips.

Throughout the year, we will hopefully have other opportunities to take the children on small local visits to places like the library and Lyme Park.

Year 4 will also go on a residential trip later this academic year – more details will follow.
