



Change	To make someone or something different	<div style="text-align: center;"> <p>Sticky Knowledge about the Great Fire of London</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> An ember from one of Thomas Farriner's bakery ovens ignited some nearby firewood. The fire quickly spread around the room and to nearby buildings <input type="checkbox"/> Samuel Pepys wrote about the fire in his own personal diary. <input type="checkbox"/> Charles II was the King of England in 1666. After the fire, he made a decree that houses must be built further apart and built from stone not timber. <input type="checkbox"/> The fire started on Sunday 2nd September 1666 in Thomas Farriner's bakery on Pudding Lane. <input type="checkbox"/> The fire lasted four days, and burned down thousands of homes. <input type="checkbox"/> People used leather buckets and water squirts to try to put the fire out, but these did not work. Later in the week, King Charles II ordered buildings to be pulled down to stop the flames from spreading. <input type="checkbox"/> Thursday 6th September 1666 The fire is finally put out. Thousands of people are left homeless. </div>  	
Time	A point of time as measured in years, hours and minutes past midnight or noon.		
Escape	break free from confinement or control.		
Disaster	a sudden accident or a natural catastrophe that causes great damage or loss of life.		
Emergency	a serious, unexpected, and often dangerous situation requiring immediate action.		
Rebuild	build (something) again after it has been damaged or destroyed.		
Restore	repair or renovate so as to return it to its original condition.
